### **DEAR FRIENDS AND SUPPORTORS:**

For over 50 years, we at the Darien YMCA have kept our promise to nurture the potential of children, promote healthy living, and foster a sense of social responsibility in the family-focused community we serve.

Today, we continue to find energy and direction in the voices of our community, and as our needs expand, so too does our vision and its scope. We are proud to say that the progress we made in 2019 is a direct reflection of this effort to broaden our community impact through education, inclusivity, responsibility, and human connection. Here are some of the highlights of our successful year:

- In 2019, we provided close to \$600,000 in financial assistance for our programs and services to provide for all families and individuals regardless of their ability to pay.
- Every week over 400 individuals reduced their stress levels and increased their awareness of their body through our mind/body classes.
- Through the help of our donors, over \$285,000 in financial assistance was awarded to 189 youth to attend Summer Camp. These kids developed new skills, made new friends, and participated in exciting adventures.

None of this would be possible without the dedicated efforts of our volunteers, donors, members, and staff, to whom we owe our deepest gratitude. As we continue to move forward in 2020, we hope this annual report reminds you of all that is possible through your continued support.

# FOSTERING YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

At the Y, we give young people a safe place to belong, to build confidence and to learn positive behaviors from strong role models who exemplify the core values of caring, honesty, respect and responsibility. Whether it be childcare, early education, youth swim and sports, or summer camp, our programs and staff provide the support and opportunities needed to help our youth learn, grow, and thrive.

#### **2019 IMPACT:**

#### A SAFE AND NURTURING PLACE:

Over 205 families belong to the Y's early education program at Holly Pond School where children have the ability to discover their potential and develop their skills. Approximately 124 children participated in the Y's Kids Club afterschool program, which provides a fun childcare option for families when the school day ends. Over \$93,000 in financial assistance was awarded to 61 children to attend Kids Club, Holly Pond School, Holly Care, or Vacation Camp in 2019.

#### **DEVELOPING A LOVE FOR SPORTS & WELLNESS:**

Over 4,500 youth built a sense of confidence and teamwork, while staying active through the Y's recreational sports programs and leagues in baseball, basketball, field hockey, flag football, futsal, pre-k soccer and volleyball. A program for every interest!

#### A SUMMER OF GROWTH & LASTING MEMORIES:

Over 750 kids attended summer camp, where they made new friends, tried new things, and made lasting memories. 189 campers received financial assistance and 50 campers were children with special needs, making our camps an inclusive and enriching experience for all.

#### **GROWING STRONGER IN AND OUT OF THE**

**WATER:** Over 417 young athletes participated in the Y's competitive aquatics teams including, House Team and Piranha's Swim Team, developing goal setting, leadership, time management, and self-confidence.

# **EMPOWERING** HEALTHY LIVING

Our mission, centered on the balance of spirit, mind and body, provides programs and resources that encourage healthy living. We make it easy for you to work out by having knowledgeable staff who care, resources and equipment that motivate healthy living, and a welcoming, supportive community who encourage your well-being.

### **2019 IMPACT**

#### **FACILITY USAGE:**

The YMCA had over 225,365 active check-ins to our facility to engage in healthy living activities like group fitness classes, swimming, sports, fitness center, weight room, personal training, small group training, wellness coaching and much more!

#### **PROMOTING WELLNESS:**

The Y continues to serve as a community resource dedicated to promoting wellness and disease prevention among people of all ages and abilities. From cardio and strength building classes, to mindbody and nutrition programs, everybody is welcome at the Y as they work toward maintaining a healthy lifestyle. Staff completed over 8,700 personal training sessions in 2019, providing accountability and motivation to help members gain strength and endurance.

### EMPOWERING THROUGH HEALTH EDUCATION:

28 participants in our Lean Machine program in 2019 experienced a total combined weight-loss of 247.47 pounds and had a total combined percent body fat lost of 98.65% increasing their self confidence and moving them towards a sustainable, healthy lifestyle.



#### **CANCER WELLNESS PROGRAM:**

29 cancer survivors participated in the REVIVE program at the YMCA. This 12-week program is available to any cancer survivor within our community at no cost and is designed to help improve the patient's ability to cope with the mental and physical stress following cancer diagnosis and treatment.

#### MAINTAINING AN ACTIVE & CONNECTED LIFESTYLE:

Over 675 seniors in our community come to the Y to stay active, healthy and connected to friends and family.



### **COMMITTED TO EXCELLENCE:** NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED GYMNASTICS & SWIM PROGRAMS

#### The Darien YMCA Gymnastics Travel Team

- In 2019, the Girls Gymnastics Team were runners-up at the 2019 YMCA National Championships in Wisconsin and Wells Fischer qualified and participated in the USA Gymnastics Junior Olympic National Championship in Indianapolis, IN.
- The Girls Team also won the 2019 YMCA State Championship Titles in the following Levels: Level 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and multiple girls and boys qualified for the USA Regional Junior Olympic Championships in 2019.
- The Boys Gymnastics Team won the Level 4 and 6 team titles at Y Nationals – Wisconsin.

### **2019 IMPACT:**

#### **TURNING NO ONE AWAY:**

The Y provided the close to \$600,000 in financial assistance, ensuring that no one is ever turned away from maintaining a healthy lifestyle at the Y.

#### **EVERYONE FEELS WELCOME:**

Over 100 individuals with special needs participated in programs and events at the Y, including Innovative Vocations, a program that focuses on vocational skills for special needs teens and young adults that strengthens peer and adult relationships, builds a strong work ethic, and teaches responsibility.

#### A PLAY TO GIVE BACK:

Over 400 individuals volunteered 9,401 hours at the Y, helping to provide services to the community, and engage in philanthropy.



#### **COMMUNITY PARTNER:**

The Y proudly supports many community organizations including: hosting meetings and special events for fellow non-profits, providing facility use for Darien organizations, and serving as the home pool for the Darien High School swim and gymnastics teams.
